Plant a Seed

All you need to grow your own bean plant is a plant pot, some compost and a bean seed (broad bean, runner bean or French beans all work well). Plant your seed, place it on a sunny windowsill, water it regularly and watch as it germinates.

Now, imagine you are George Washington Carver's assistant as he travels around America sharing his agricultural knowledge. Your job is to teach people how to grow beans. Can you write a set of instructions on how to grow bean seedlings that you can give to people who visit your mobile classroom?



Get Cooking!

George Washington Carver is looking for a tasty dish to help him persuade people to eat more sweet potatoes. He needs your help!

Choose a recipe that contains sweet potatoes such as sweet potato soup, sweet potato fries or even sweet potato cookies.

Ask an adult to help you follow the recipe.

When your sweet potato dish is complete, share it with your friends.

How many marks out of ten will they give your dish for flavour, appearance and texture?

Does it make them want to eat more sweet potatoes?
